Local Oversight of New Toll Roads

HB102

Toll Roads, Highways, and Bridges - County Government Consent Requirement - Expansion

Why Is This Legislation Necessary?

Currently, there is a prohibition on State agencies constructing a toll road, toll highway, or toll bridge without the consent of a majority of the affected counties; however, at this time, that prohibition only applies to counties on the Eastern Shore.

- 1. Honoring local plans for growth: Where and how a county grows and does not grow is decided locally through a participatory planning process. A new State toll road, toll highway, or toll bridge could undermine local planning by creating development pressure outside of areas planned for growth.
- 2. All counties should have the right of consent: New State toll roads, toll highways, and toll bridges can have dramatic long-term impacts to the fiscal and environmental health of a county, as well as to the quality of life enjoyed by residents. The City of Baltimore and all of Maryland's 23 counties should have the right to prohibit such a project if it is not in the best interest of its residents.

What Does This Legislation Do?

This legislation extends a prohibition on State agencies constructing a toll road, toll highway, or toll bridge without the consent of a majority of the affected counties to all counties in the State.

What Will This Legislation Cost?

There is no fiscal impact associated with this legislation.
