

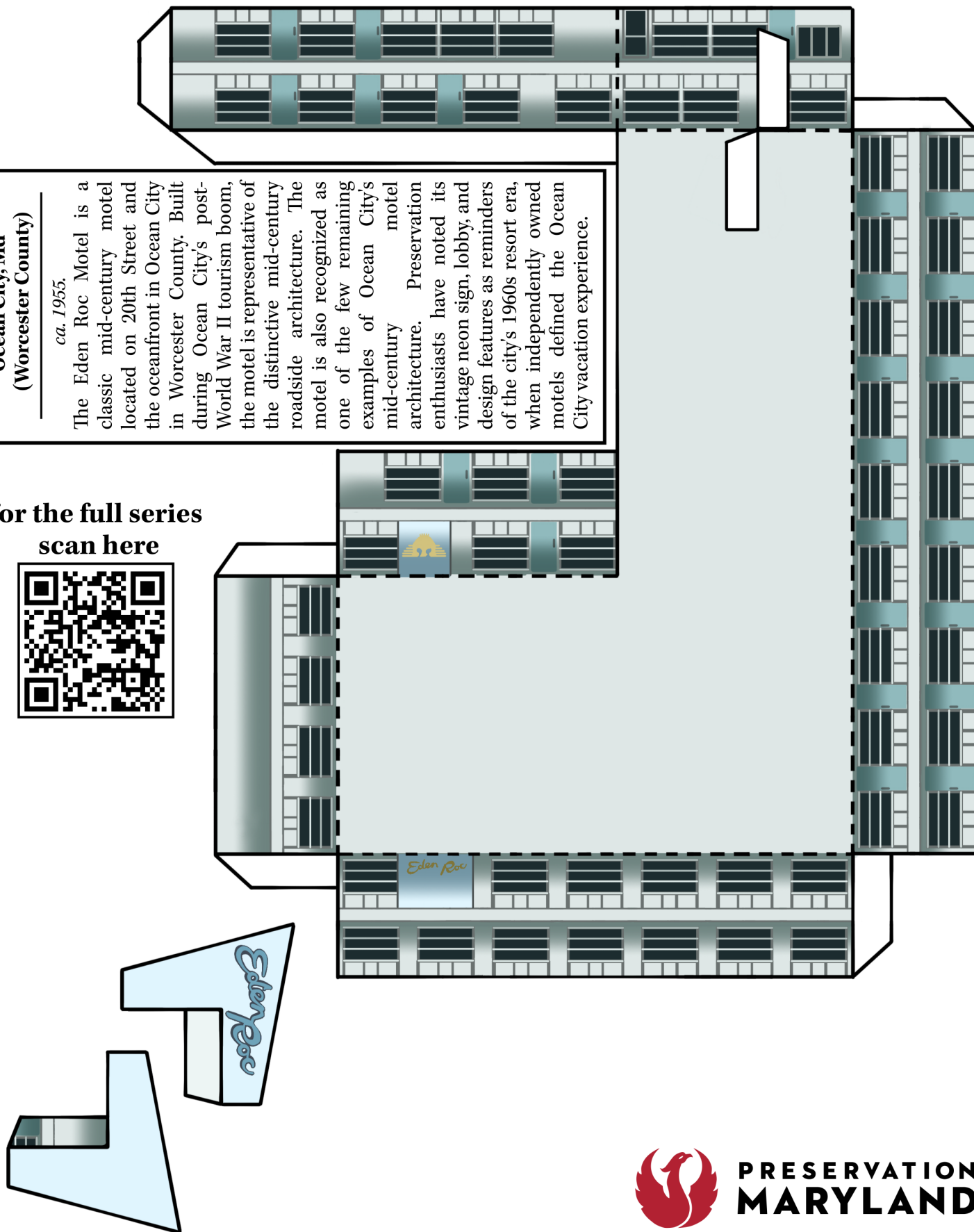
Building Communities: Telling Maryland's Story Through Historic Architecture

Eden Roc Hotel Ocean City, Md (Worcester County)

The Eden Roc Motel is a classic mid-century motel located on 20th Street and the oceanfront in Ocean City in Worcester County. Built during Ocean City's post-World War II tourism boom, the motel is representative of the distinctive mid-century roadside architecture. The motel is also recognized as one of the few remaining examples of Ocean City's mid-century motel architecture. Preservation enthusiasts have noted its vintage neon sign, lobby, and design features as reminders of the city's 1960s resort era, when independently owned motels defined the Ocean City vacation experience.

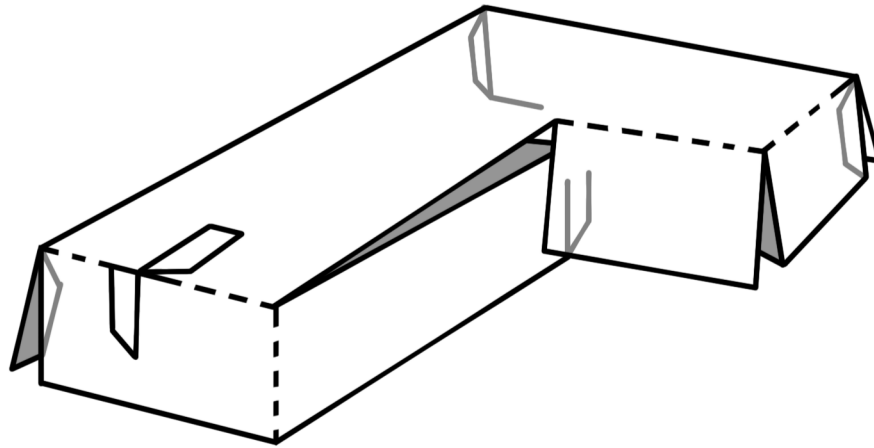
