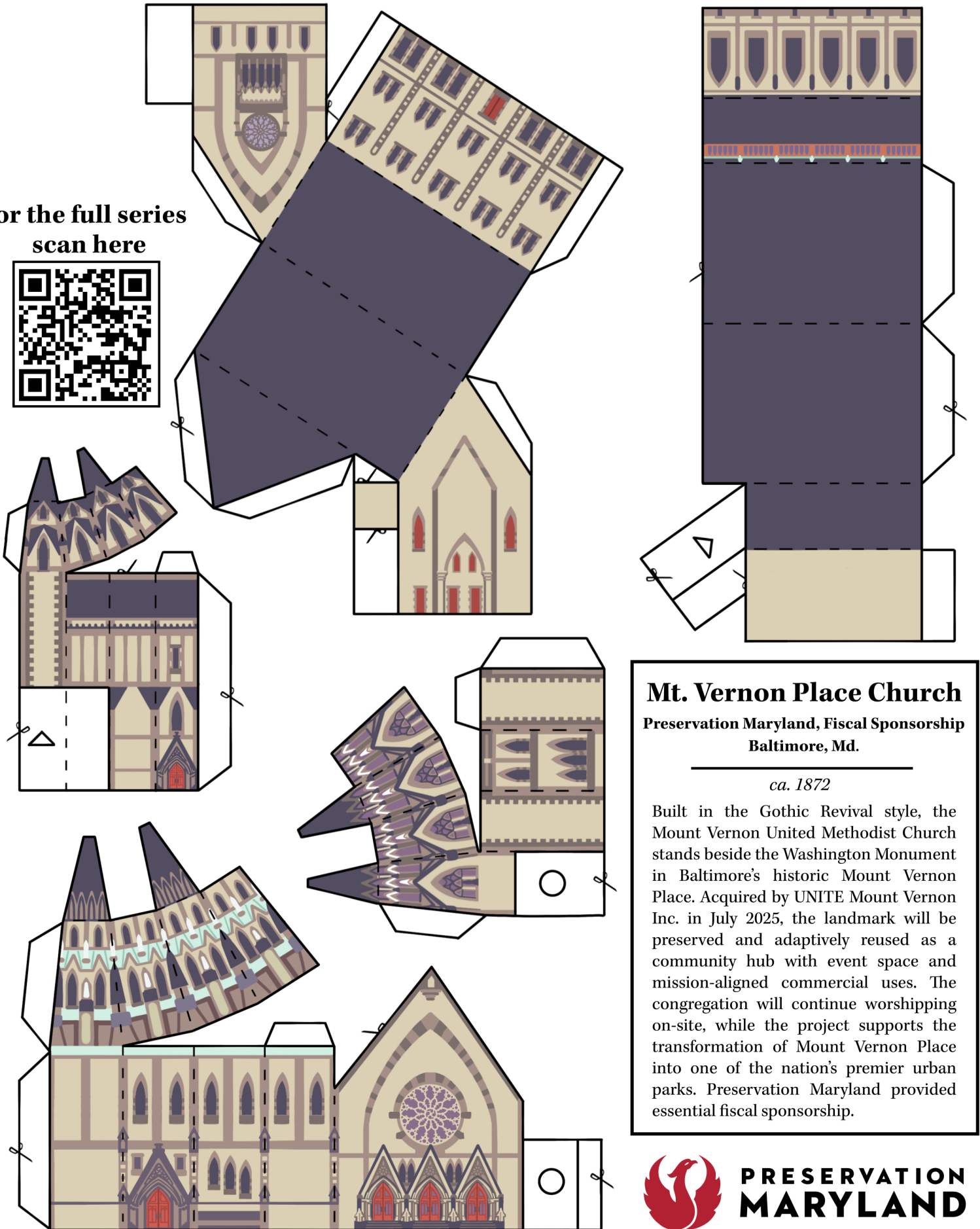


Building Communities: Telling Maryland's Story Through Historic Architecture

Built in the Gothic Revival style, the Mount Vernon United Methodist Church stands beside the Washington Monument in Baltimore's historic Mount Vernon Place. Acquired by UNITE Mount Vernon Inc. in July 2025, the landmark will be preserved and adaptively reused as a community hub with event space and mission-aligned commercial uses. The congregation will continue worshipping on-site, while the project supports the transformation of Mount Vernon Place into one of the nation's premier urban parks. Preservation Maryland provided essential fiscal sponsorship.

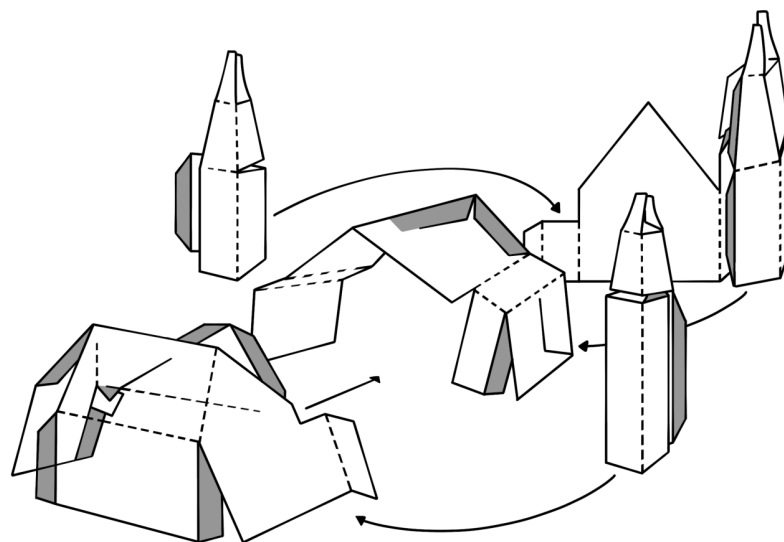
