

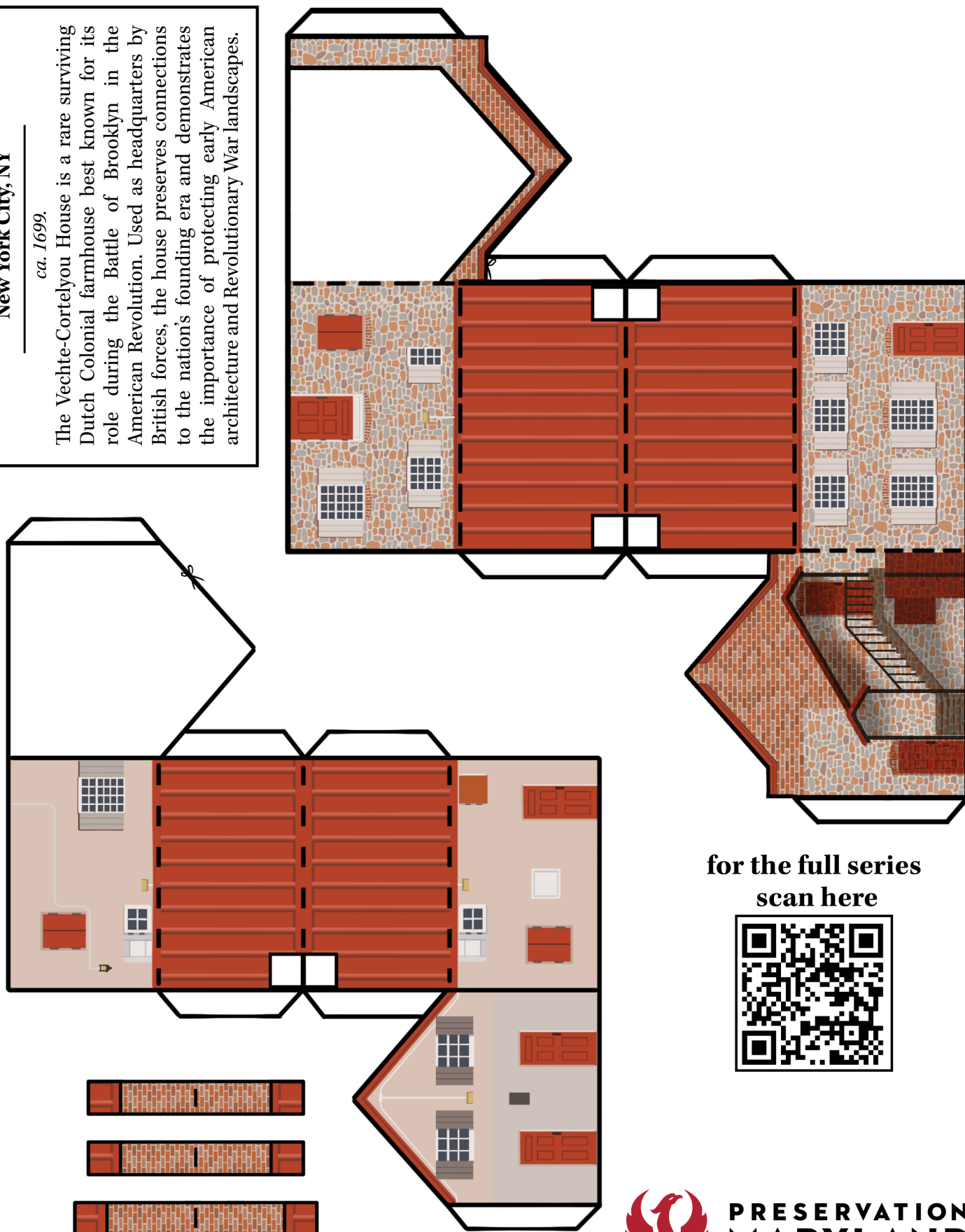
Building Communities: Telling Maryland's Story Through Historic Architecture

Vechte-Cortelyou House

New York City, NY

The Vechte-Cortelyou House is a rare surviving Dutch Colonial farmhouse best known for its role during the Battle of Brooklyn in the American Revolution. Used as headquarters by British forces, the house preserves connections to the nation's founding era and demonstrates the importance of protecting early American architecture and Revolutionary War landscapes.

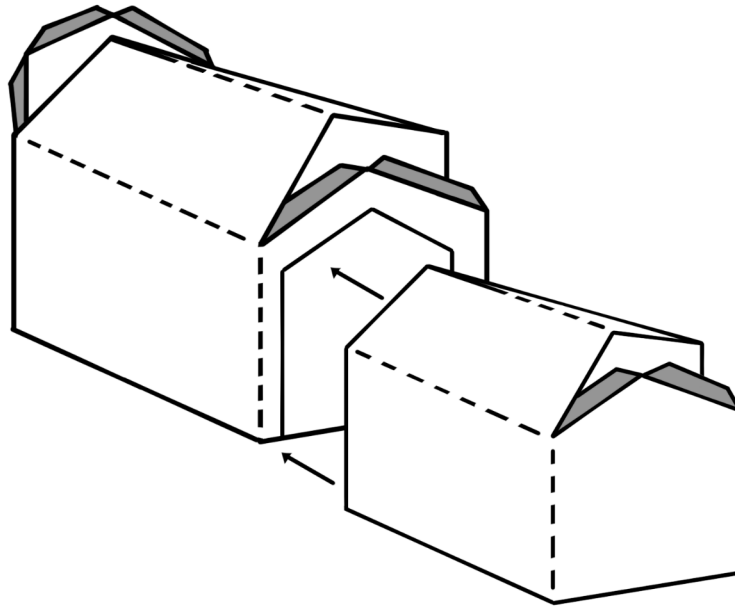

Instructions

Cut out the buildings along the solid edge of the structure, leaving in the tabs. Fold the paper along the dotted lines. Glue the shaded tabs to the areas shown in the example image above. Glue each separate structure to the indicated areas in the drawing above.



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
