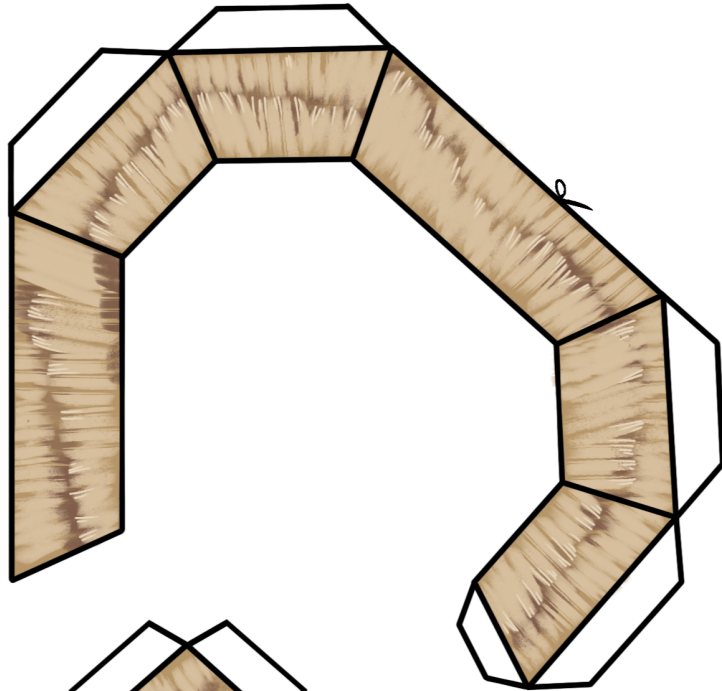
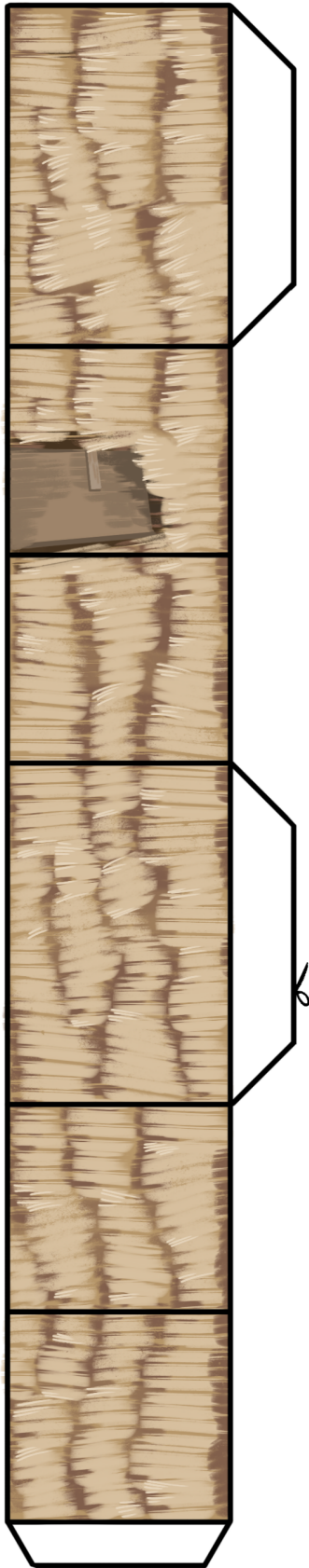

Woodland Period Building Maryland

ca. 1250 B.C. - 1600 A.D.

Semi-permanent structures like this were constructed and used by Indigenous peoples in what is now Maryland for hundreds of years. Made from a variety of local materials including wood, small saplings, wovens mats, and grasses, buildings like these were used for storage and everyday life. Archaeologists are able find evidence of these structures by the marks they leave behind in the soil.

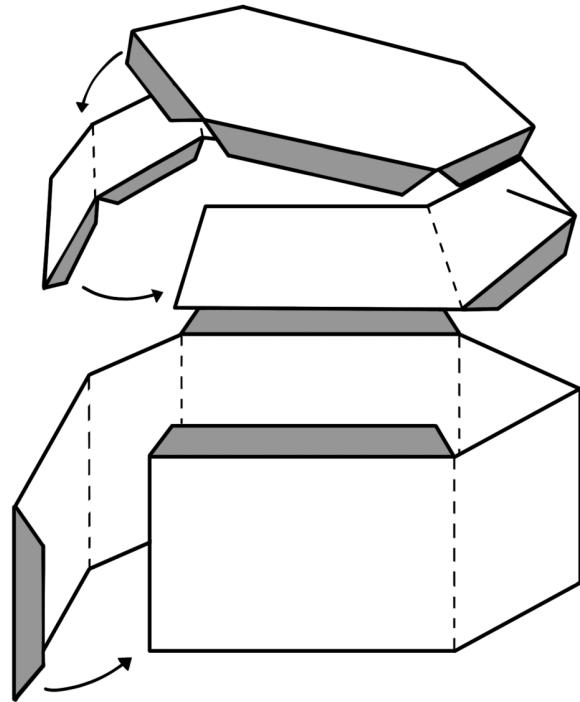
