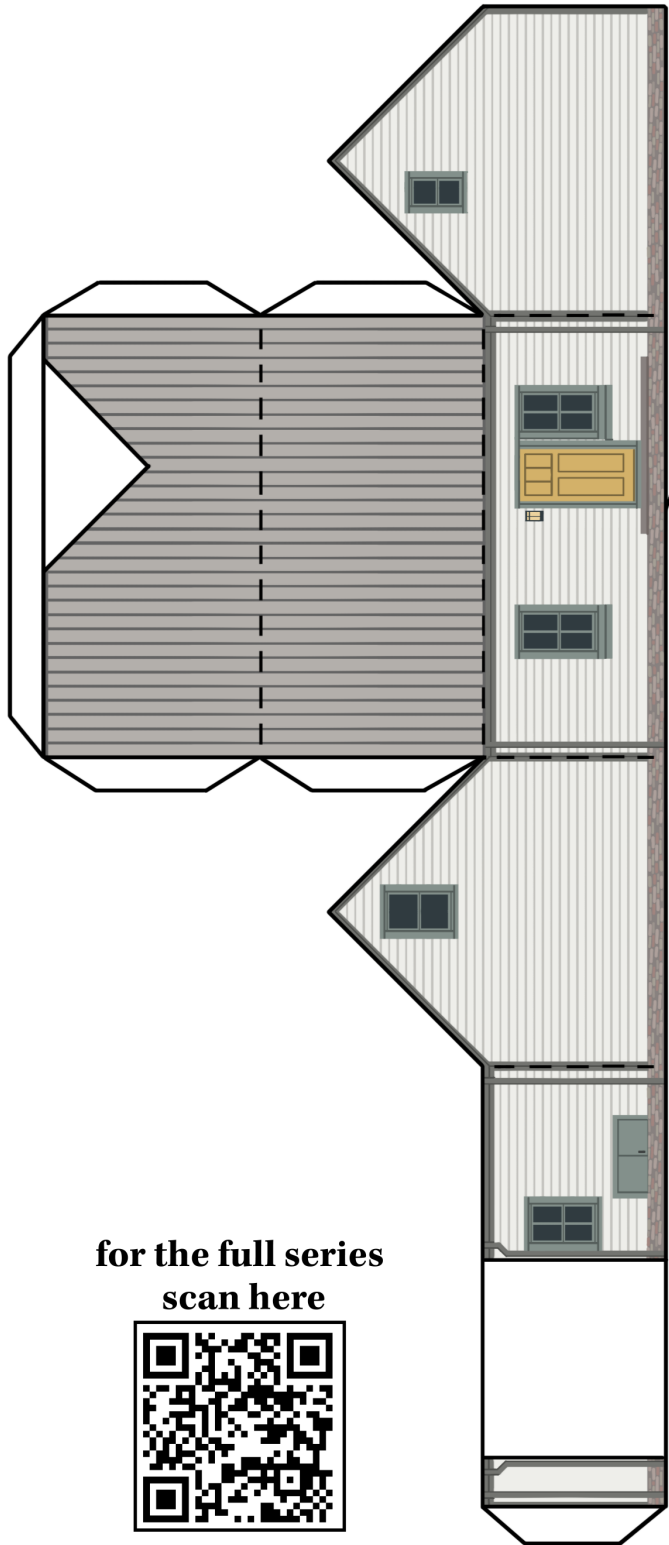


Building Communities: Telling Maryland's Story Through Historic Architecture

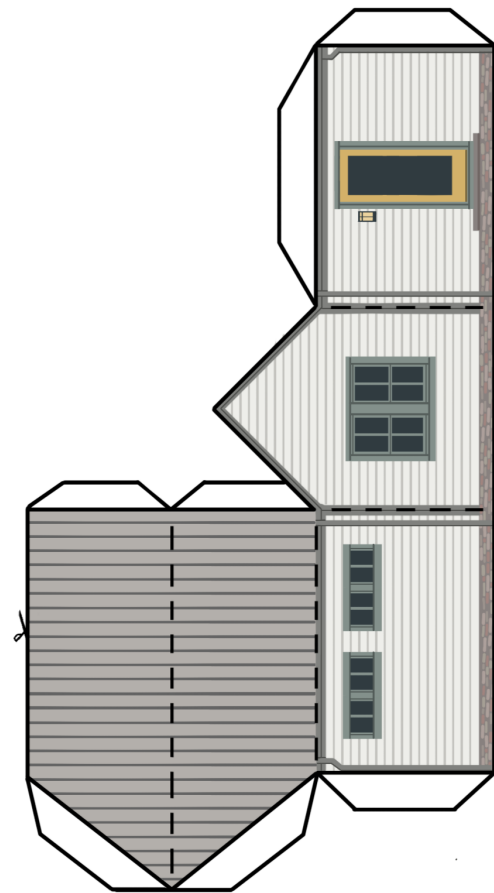


Jonathan Street Cabin

417 N. Jonathan Street is one of Hagerstown's oldest surviving buildings and a landmark in the city's historic Jonathan Street neighborhood, one of Maryland's oldest African American communities. Built in the 1830s using, the cabin reflects generations of Black history, resilience, and community. In 2018, Preservation Maryland stepped in to save the threatened structure from demolition, carefully restoring it through its Historic Property Redevelopment Program.

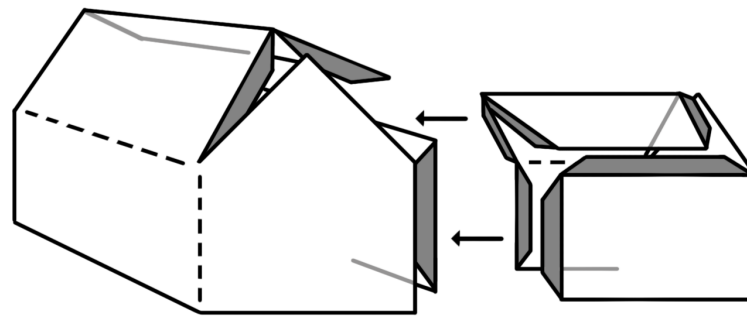
Protecting Our Past, Investing in Our Future
